Introduction

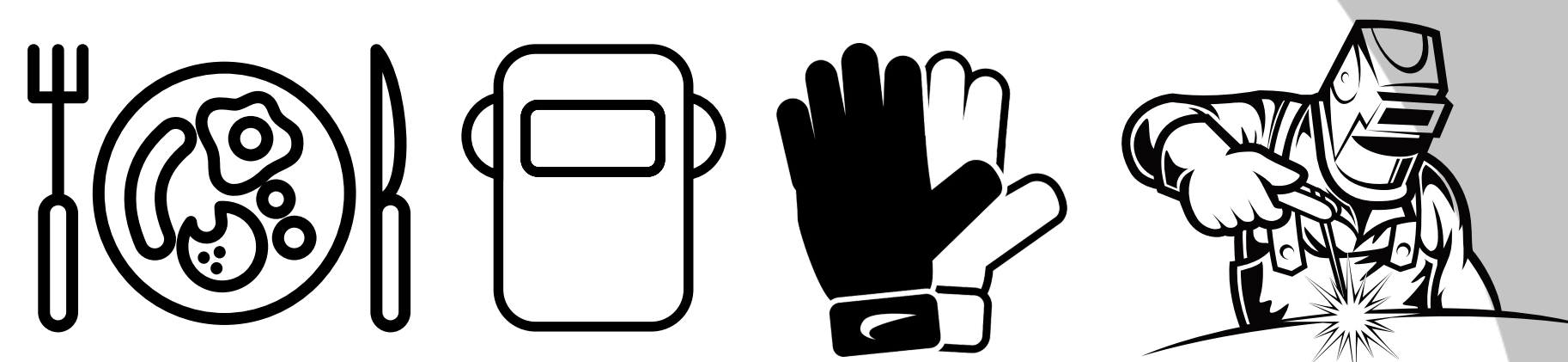
The Agricultural Mechanics Association (AMA) at Texas State University utilizes service learning in the form of community-based welding workshops.

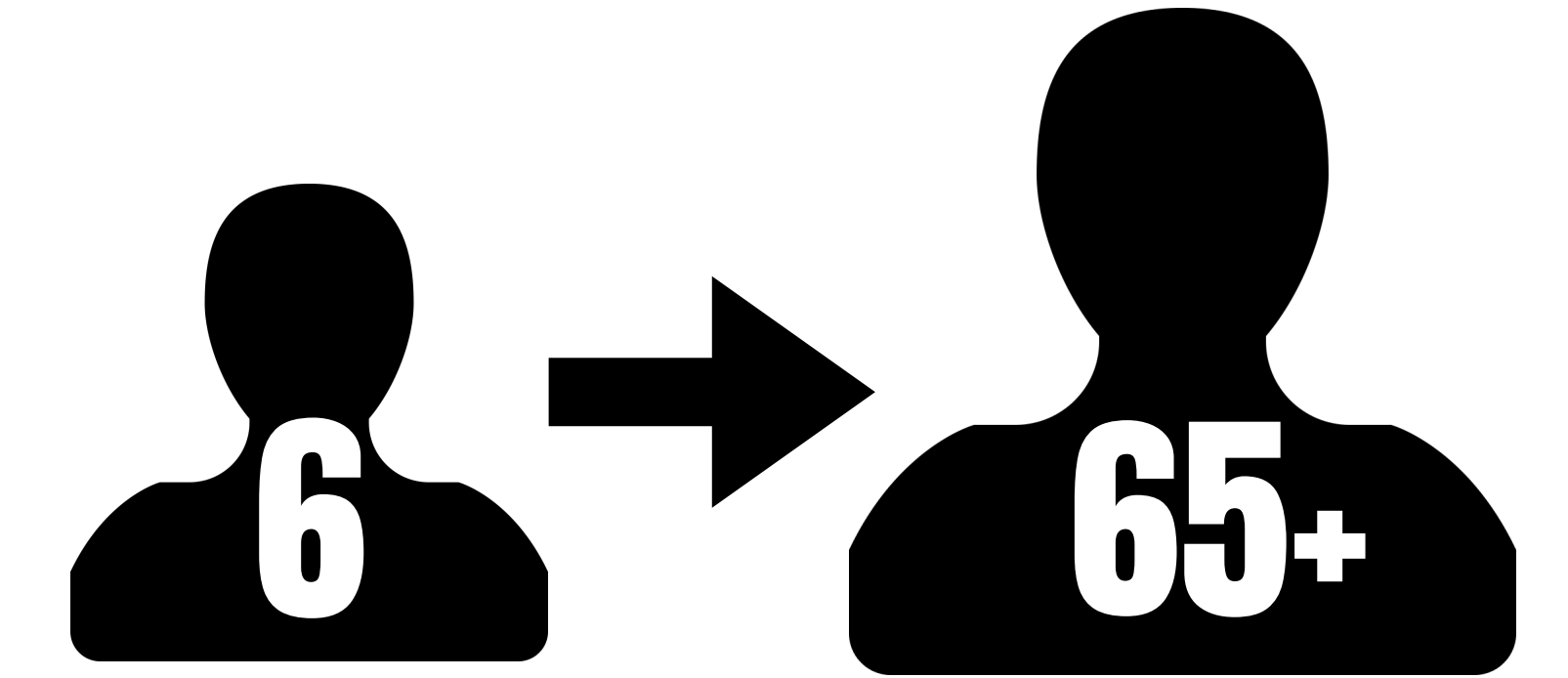
